WORKSHOP ON 'COMPENTACY BASED LEARNING IN SCIENCE'



The workshop was spearheaded by esteemed resource person Dr. Geeta Shukla, a Master trainer with CBSE, certified Global Career Counselor, & a founder of mindful Counsellors, delved into various aspects of assessment methodologies. The workshop placed a special emphasis on the refinement of multiple-choice questions (MCQs) and free-response questions (FRQs), along with ensuring the quality of questions aligned with curricular priorities. Dr. Shukla elucidated guidelines for crafting MCQs, stressing the importance of establishing clear curricular priorities to inform question development. A cornerstone of the workshop was elucidating the key principles of effective assessment. Participants gained insights into the intricacies of designing high-quality MCQs and FRQs, including the parameters for rating their efficacy. Dr. Shukla underscored the necessity of considering Bloom's taxonomy beyond mere recall and understanding levels, ensuring questions encompass higher-order thinking skills. Critical to the workshop's objectives was understanding the characteristics of a good stimulus, which serves as the foundation for FRQs. Moreover, Dr. Shukla highlighted the significance of blueprinting, marking schemes, and rubrics in ensuring fair and objective assessment, required. Furthermore, the level of questions should encompass various dimensions of Bloom's taxonomy, fostering holistic learning and assessment experiences. Little Scholars School organized an awareness session on Eye problems and its prevention in the ongoing safety week of 2024. The session was conducted by none other than Dr. Amrita Chauhan, an Ex-Student of Little Scholars from the 2003 batch and a renowned Ophthalmologist with a Fellowship in Intraocular surgery and medical retina.

Dr. Amrita led a session for students of classes 3-8 in the auditorium, followed by an interactive discussion on eye wellness, educating and guiding students on how to take care of their eye health in this digital age.

She emphasized that staring at digital screens for too long can lead to tired, itchy, dry eyes, and even blurred vision and headaches, especially in children who spend prolonged periods playing games on mobile phones. She highlighted the risks of high refractive errors and eye infections due to constant screen exposure and eye rubbing.

Dr. Amrita recommended annual eye check-ups and suggested precautions such as using anti-reflective glasses or screens, frequent blinking, consuming fresh green and red/orange vegetables and fruits, and following the 20-20-20 rule.

Students showed immense interest and received personalized solutions to their eye-related concerns, making the session both knowledgeable and inspiring.

Under the guidance of Mrs. Meenakshi Rastogi, Biology teacher, her students – Gurmil Kaur, Ritika, and Himani – took the lead in conducting blood group tests.

Utilizing blood typing kits, they demonstrated their knowledge of antigens and antibodies in a practical setting, testing the blood groups of volunteers, including parents, teachers, and fellow students.

The students employed a range of equipment for this process, including Antisera A, B, and D (which contain antibodies), slides, prickers, Dettol, and cotton. By observing the clumping (agglutination) of red blood cells, they were able to accurately identify the blood groups of the participants. This hands-on activity not only provided them with invaluable practical experience but also reinforced their theoretical understanding of blood typing.It was a great exposure to the students.

This initiative exemplified the school's commitment to blending academic knowledge with real-world applications, fostering both community spirit and educational growth.

Ganga Basin Water Table Project




World Environment Day

Little Scholars Unleash Eco-Magic: Rescuing Finn Weaver Birds


